Basic Editing Processes:

Cropping:

Take more than you want and can then
either crop to a preset size or input
own size

Square



Cloning:

- Clone/Copy part of a photo to another part of the photo
- Use to remove an unwanted “thing”
- Can adjust size of area to be copied from
- See a preview of the change before committing

Red Eye Removal:

Use this function to remove "red eye" from a photo if your camera doesn't have it or it doesn't work

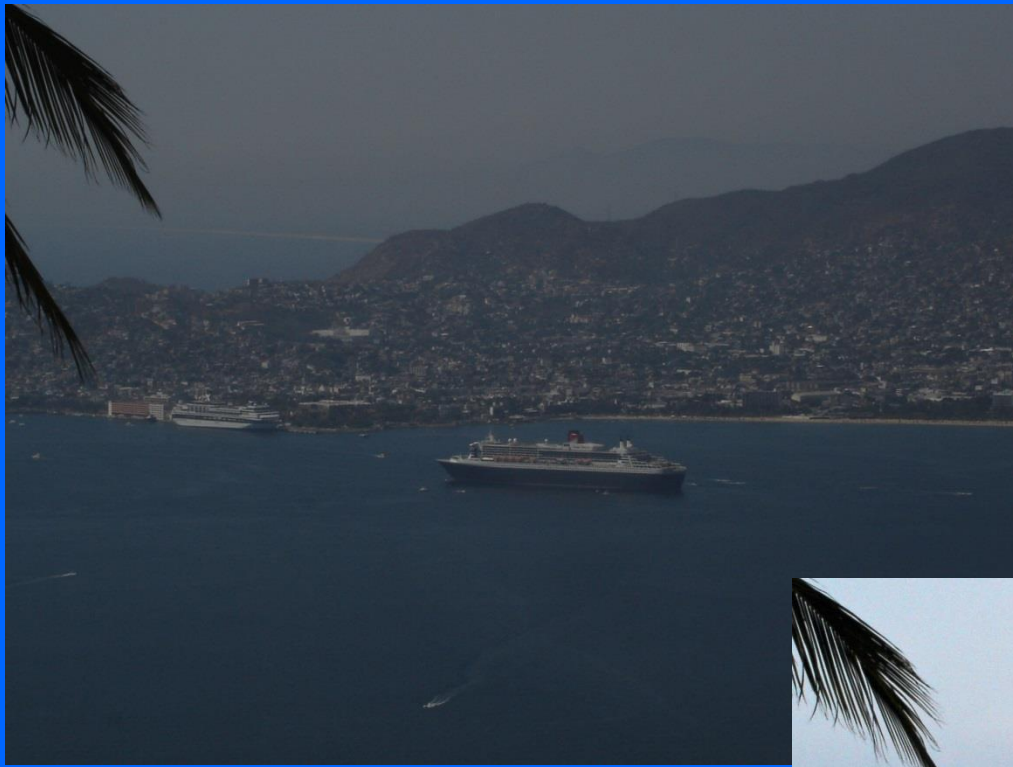


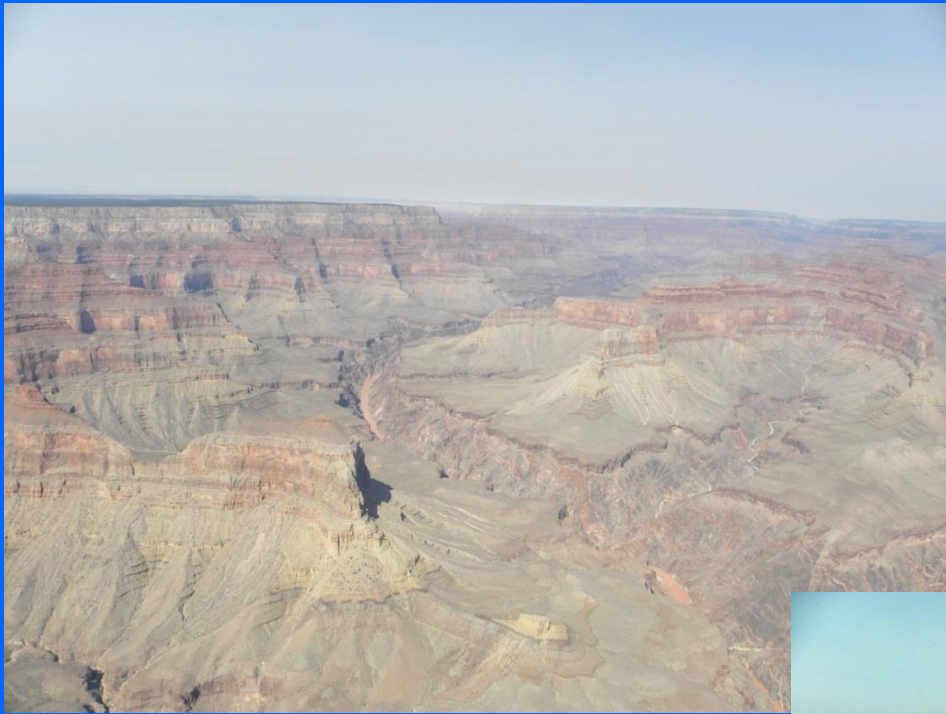
Colour/Brightness Improvement:

Handy function when the photo is not intentionally level and needs levelling

Level and Title



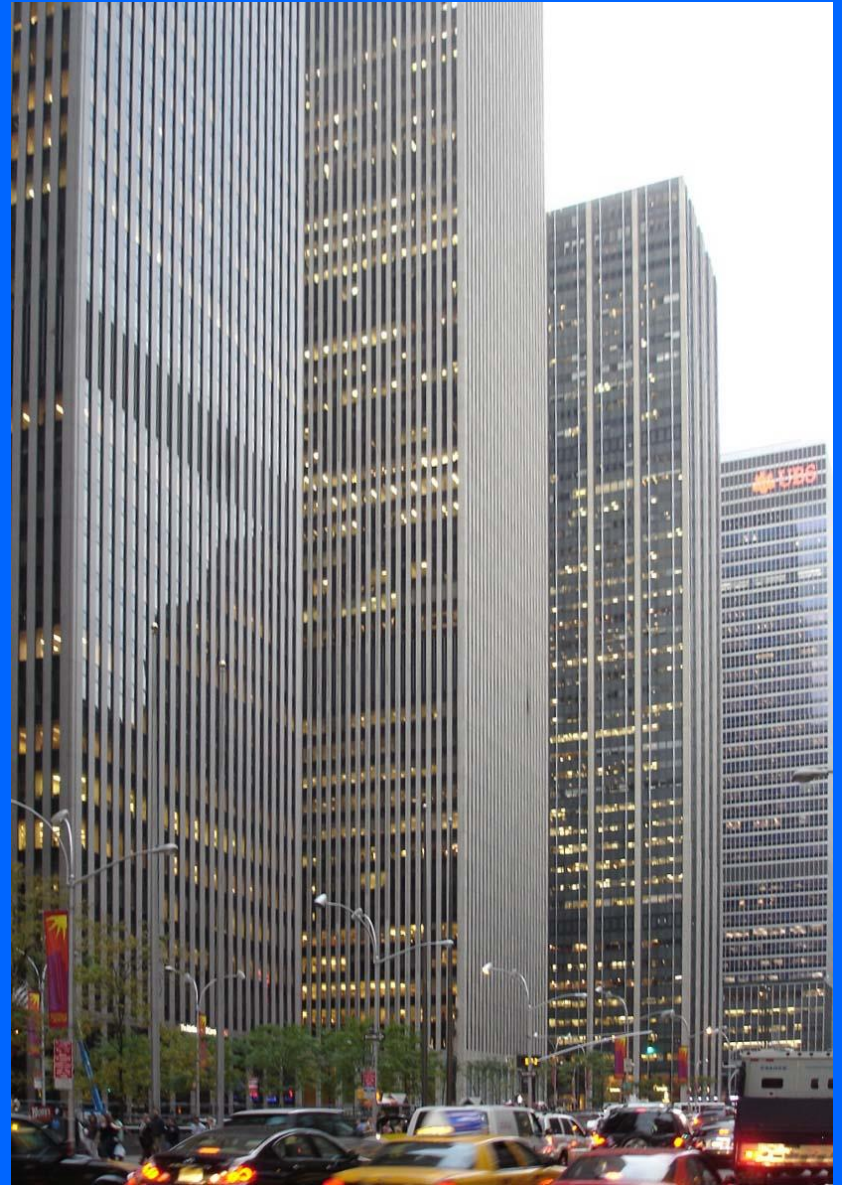


The Grand Canal, Venice



Correcting Distortion

When the object is falling over because the camera is not as good as one's eyes!



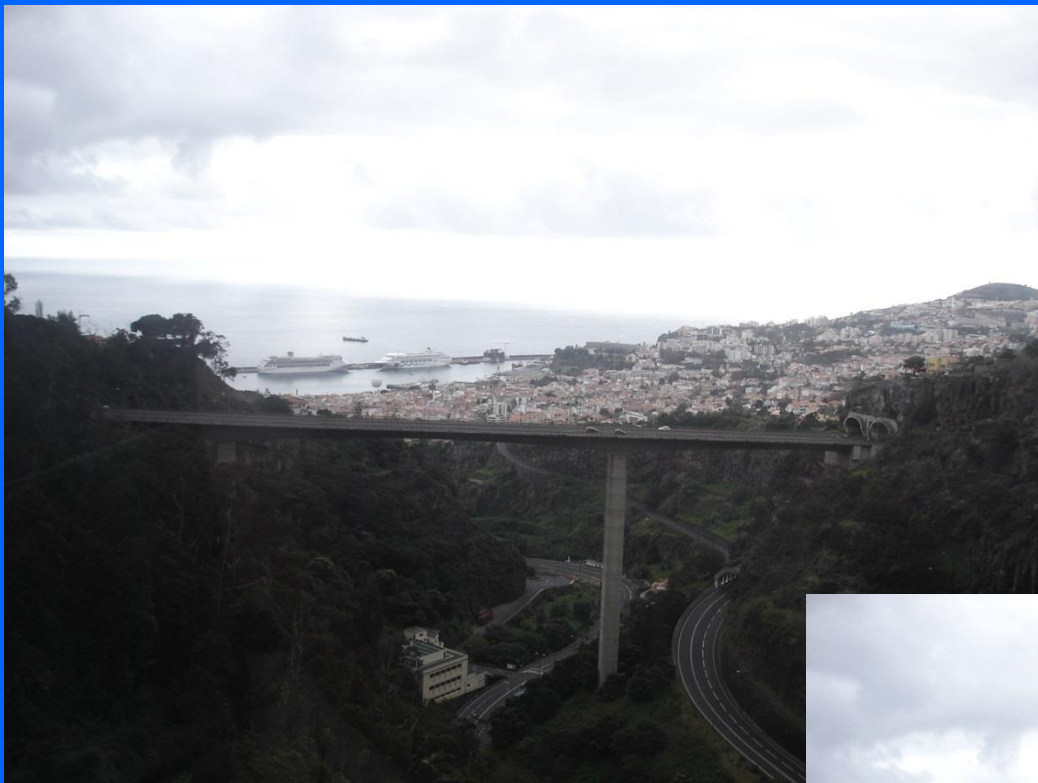
Editing Part of the Photo



Improving part of a photo:

Use a suitable tool to select the part of the photo to be improved and then adjust as necessary to improve lighting and colour





Copying Part of One Photo to Another Photo:

- Use suitable tool, eg quick selection tool to get object
- Select edit and copy
- Open second photo
- Edit and paste
