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Speed in Photography

3 types of 'speed'

Frozen subject

Panning effect in camera

Post processing

Frozen subject

Shutter speed >1000th minimum

Auto ISO

Continuous autofocus to track the subject

Burst mode to capture several frames quickly

Wide aperture

Photo settings

Shutter speed >1000, ISO 3200, f11



Motion blur

Panning effect

Smoothly twist upper body

Slowish shutter speed

Continuous autofocus

Burst mode

Photo settings
Shutter speed 60th, ISO 400, f11



Slow Shutter

Another Motion Blur

Camera still

Slow shutter speed

Photo settings
Shutter speed 5th, ISO 100, f8



Zoom blur

Looks like you're accelerating

Change the Zoom

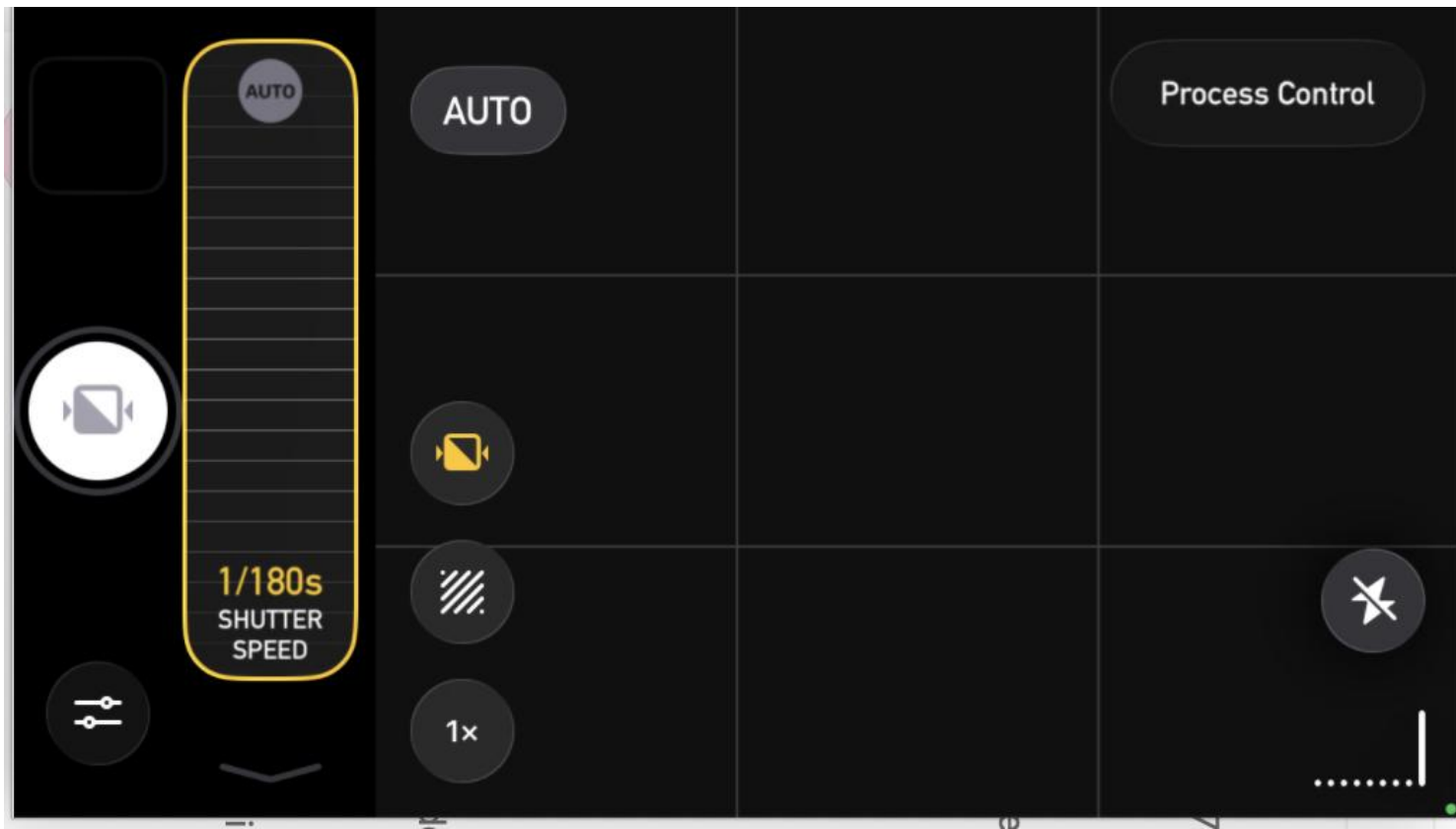

mimics the look of a camera zooming during exposure

dynamic illusion of motion by blurring the image in a circular pattern around a specified central point.

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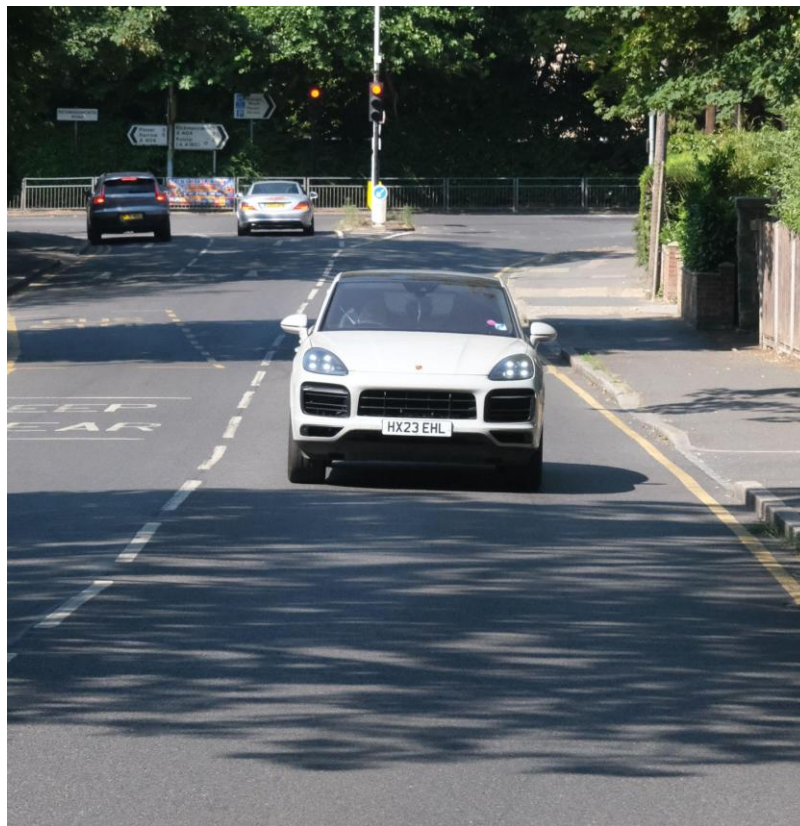

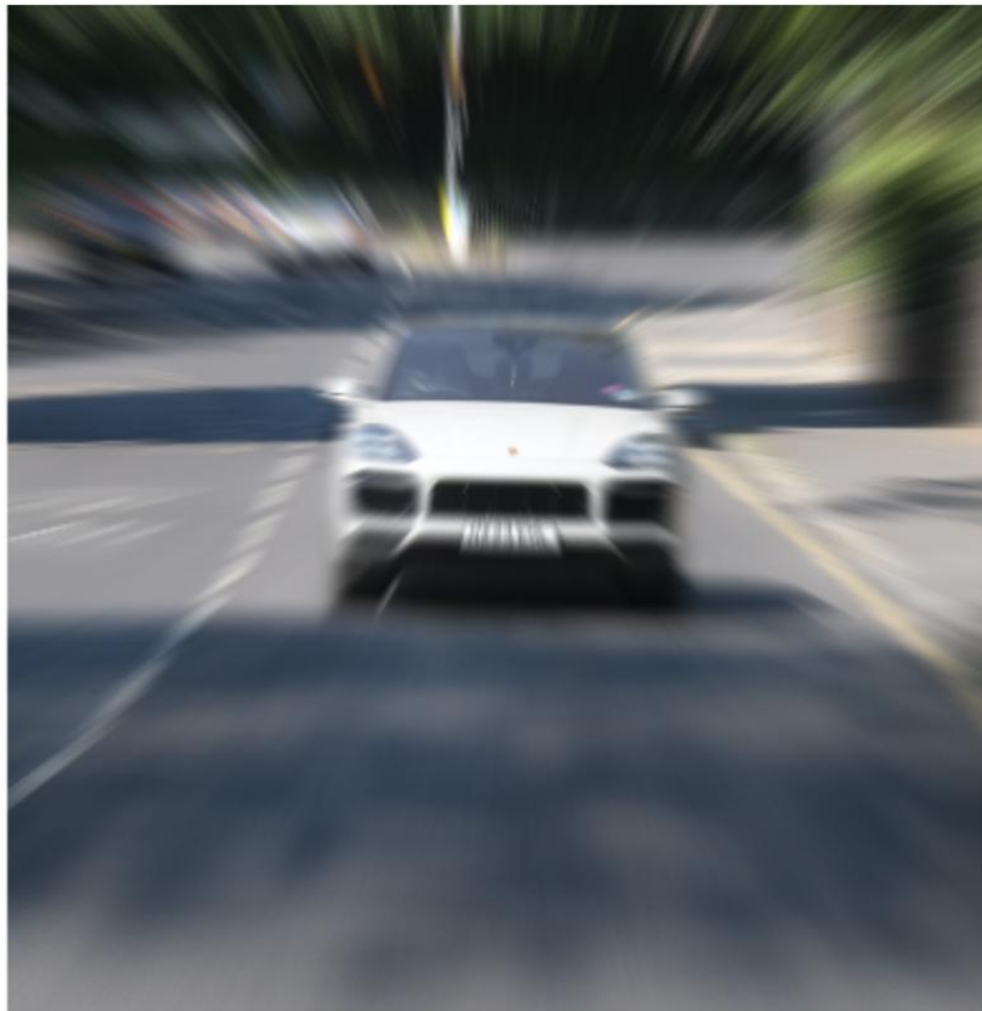

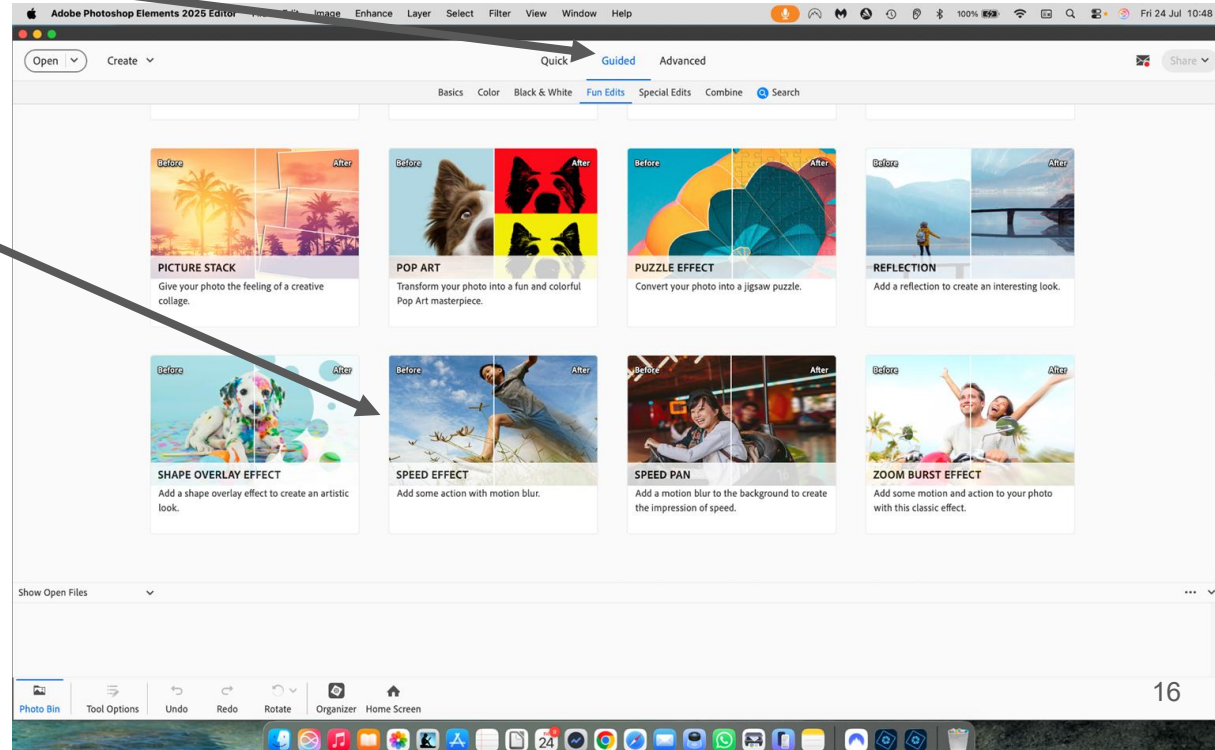

Photoshop Elements - Speed Effect

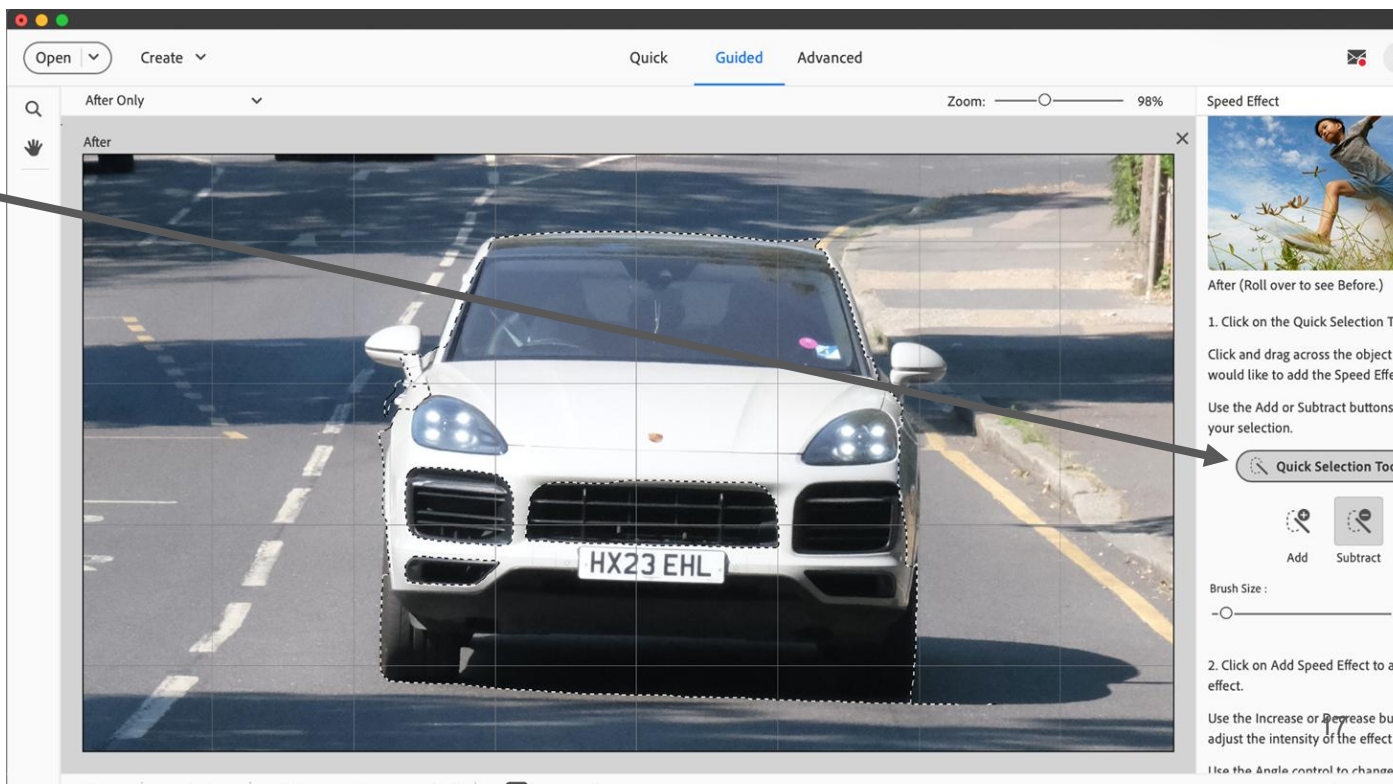
Select Guided Mode,

Specify area for motion

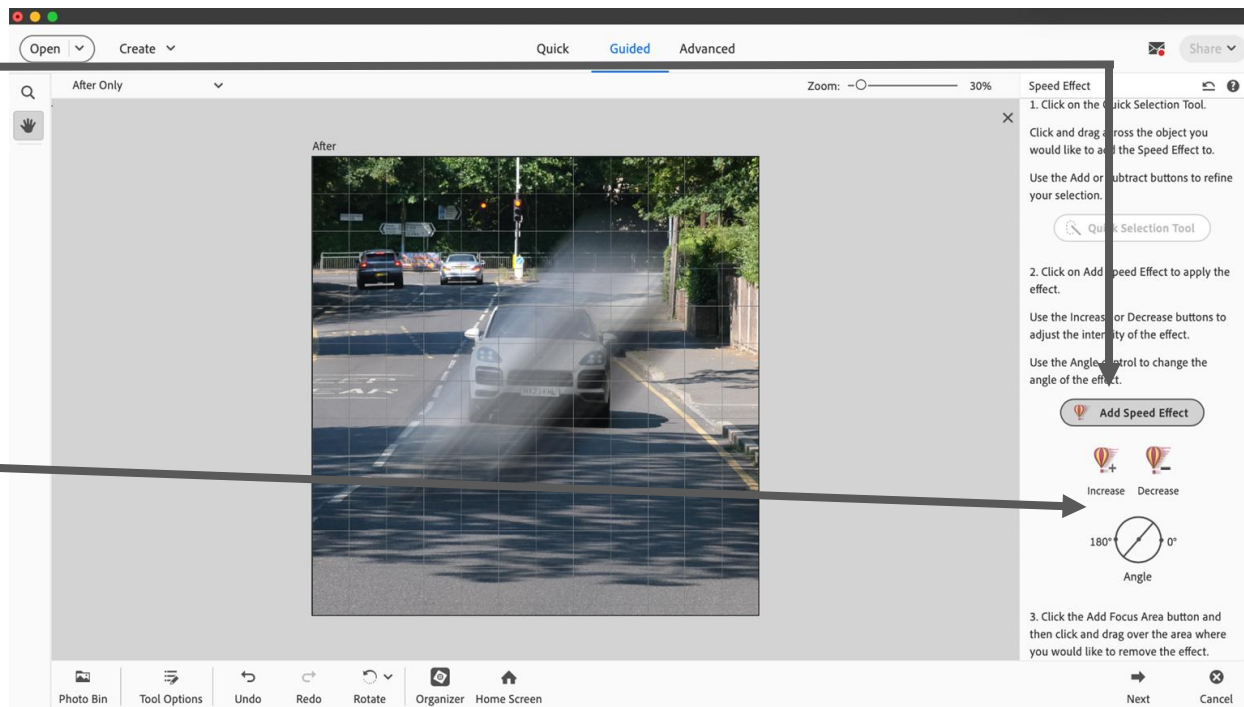
Click on Quick select

Photoshop Elements - Speed Effect

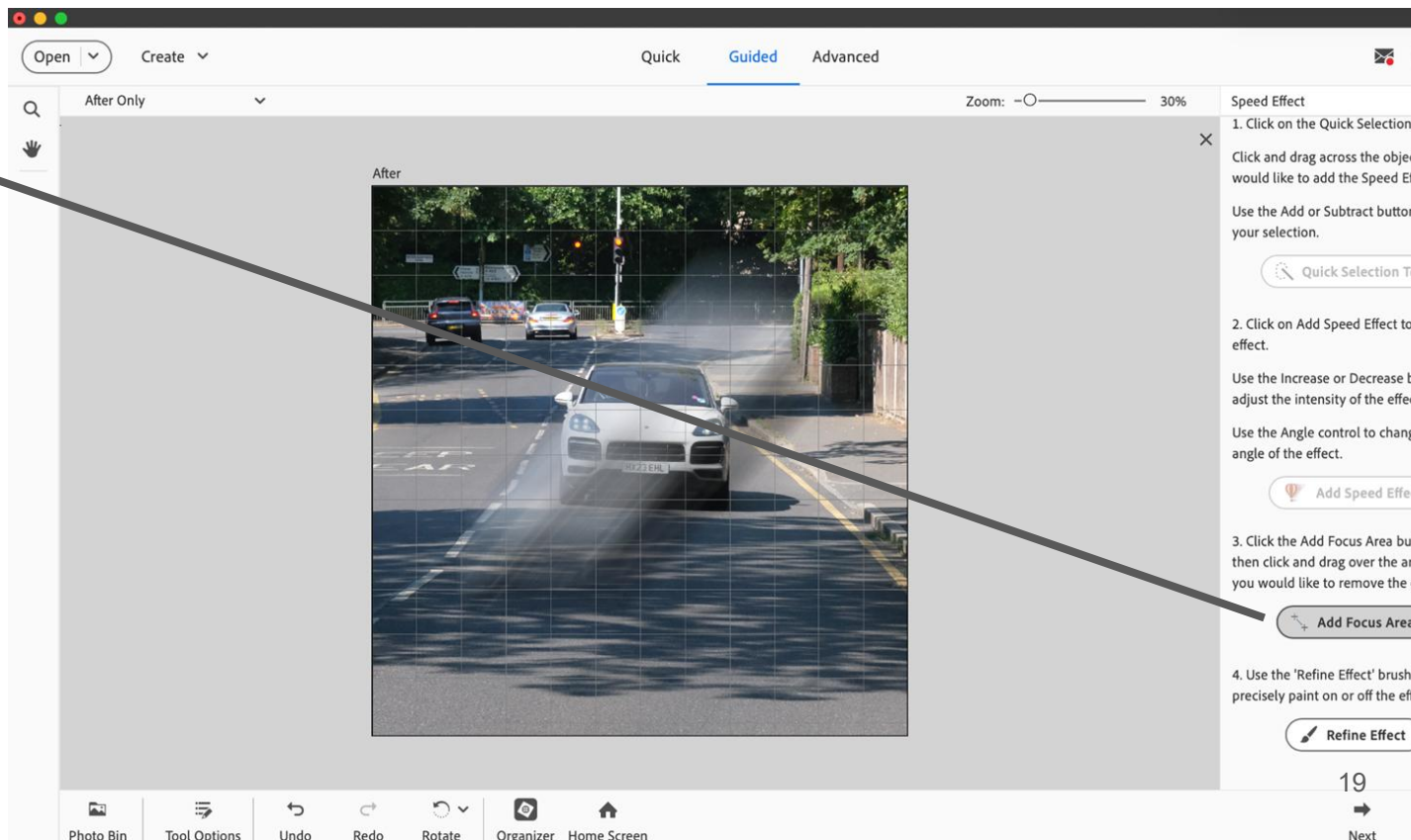
Select Speed Effect

Adjust strength & angle



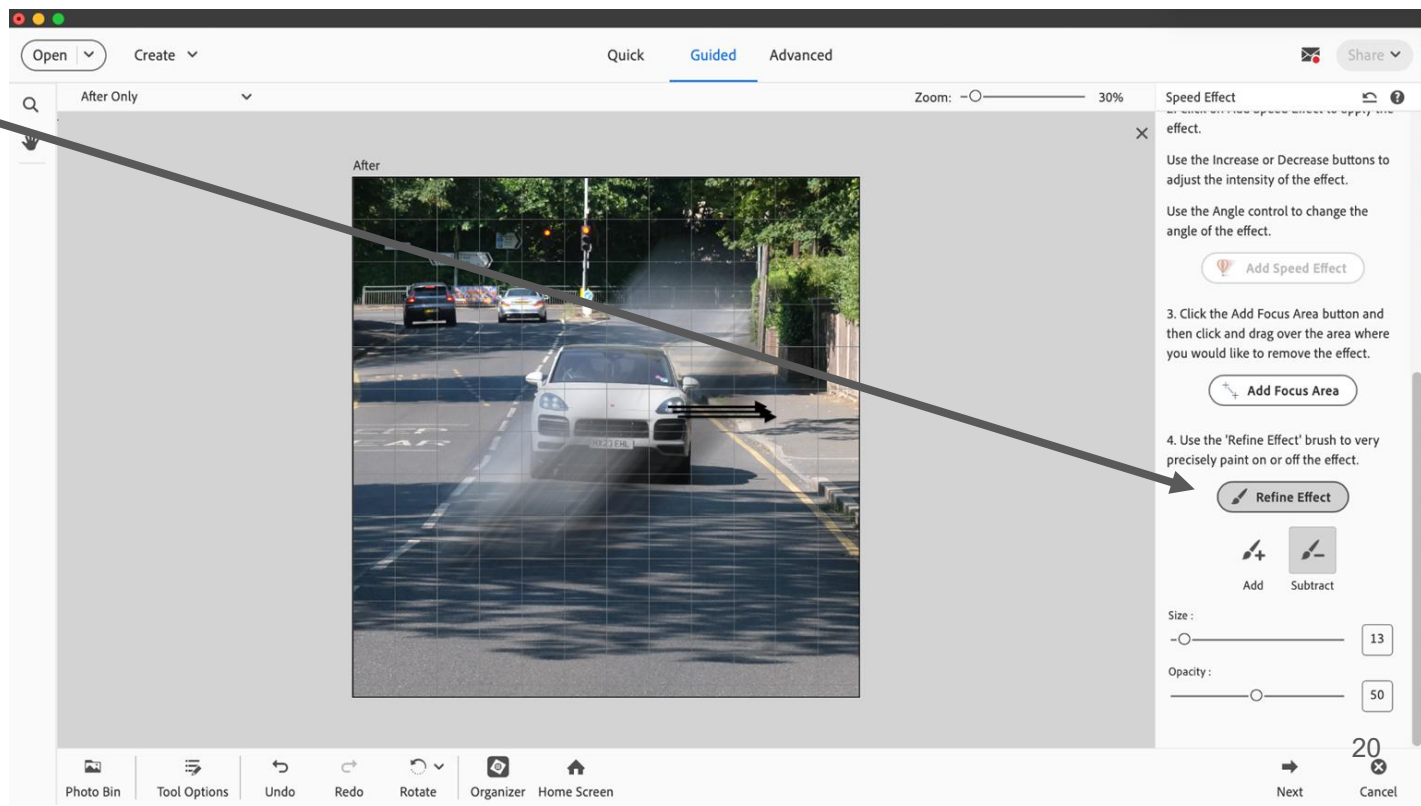
Photoshop Elements - Speed Effect
